

Witnesham & Swilland Parish Council Police Report

Wednesday 19th May 2010

Since the last meeting there has been 6 recorded crimes in Witnesham and 1 in Swilland

Witnesham

- Burglary (other building) – Weyland Road – between 10:10am & 1:15 pm Friday 19th March – shed broken into but nothing stolen – Undetected crime
- Criminal Damage (other) – Weyland Road – between Monday 22nd & Wednesday 24th March – damage caused to wooden fence – Undetected crime
- Criminal Damage (other) – Burwash – between Midnight & 8 am Sunday 4th April – entry gained to rear garden via INSECURE gate and item in garden damaged – Undetected crime
- Theft (other) – Jubby's Hill – between 2 pm & 4 pm Wednesday 7th April – scrap copper piping stolen from garden – Undetected crime
- Criminal Damage (other) – Weyland Road – between 8:30 am Monday 26th & 1 pm Tuesday 27th April – Graffiti sprayed on to wall of garage – Undetected crime
- Burglary (other building) – Tuddenham Lane – between 9:30 pm Thursday 13th & 8 am Friday 14th May – scrap metal stolen from INSECURE outbuilding – Undetected crime

Swilland

- Burglary (other building) – Unknown street – between 7 pm Wednesday 7th & 4 pm Friday 9th April – INSECURE barn entered & electrical cable stolen from within – Undetected crime

Allotment Watch is a community based crime prevention scheme, which works on the same principles as Neighbourhood Watch but is directed at allotment holders.

The aims of Allotment Watch are :

- To raise awareness amongst all allotment holders to become more vigilant to the threat of crime on the allotments
- To provide a communication system, which will enable members to have relevant information passed to them from the police
- To develop the community spirit in order that everyone looks after each other's welfare
- To ensure the security of all property on the allotments
- To have regular liaison between police and allotment holders

Responsibilities of the members are :

- To security mark their property
- To receive and act upon information received from their Safer Neighbourhood Team Officers or Crime Reduction Officer
- To share information with other members of the local community and with the local police
- To keep an eye on adjoining plots, sheds and land and report anything suspicious to the police
- To actively promote crime prevention
