

Witnesham & Swilland Parish Council Police Report

Wednesday 15th September 2010

Since your last meeting, and up until the 10th Sept 10, there have been 6 recorded crimes in the Witnesham area and 1 in Swilland : -

Witnesham –

- Criminal Damage (dwelling) – Weyland Road – between 10:30pm Sat 24th & 8am Sun 25th July 10 – Outer pane of glass in double glazed door smashed – Undetected crime
- Theft (other) – Rose Hill – between 4pm Sat 31st July & 10am Sun 1st Aug 10 – Trailer stolen from a garden – Undetected crime
- Criminal Damage (dwelling) – Weyland Road – between Tue 20th & Sat 31st July 10 – Curtain pole pulled off wall – Detected crime
- Theft (other) – Rose Hill – between Sat 31st July & Mon 2nd Aug 10 – Ceramic house name sign stolen from post outside front of property – Undetected crime
- Theft (other) – Weyland Road – between 1am & 11am Wed 25th Aug 10 – items stolen from rear garden via INSECURE gate – Investigation ongoing
- Criminal Damage (vehicle) – Weyland Road – between Tue 3rd & Wed 4th Aug 10 – Aerial on vehicle bent and paintwork scratched – Undetected crime

Swilland –

- Burglary (dwelling) – High Road – between 11:30am & 12:45pm Tue 20th July 10 – Property entered through INSECURE door and items stolen from within – Undetected crime

- Customer feedback means you will get a balanced recommendation.
