

Witnesham & Swilland Parish Council Police Report

Wednesday 17th March 2010

Firstly please accept my apologies for not being able to attend this meeting. Since your last meeting, and up until the 10th March 2010, there have been 6 recorded crimes in the Witnesham parish area and 0 recorded crimes in the Swilland parish area.

- Burglary (dwelling) – Upper Street – between 0850 & 1640 Wed 20th January 2010 – property entered via forcing window during the day and items stolen from within – Undetected crime
- Theft (from motor vehicle) – Coopers Close – between 1830 Tue 26th & 0700 Wed 27th January 2010 – petrol cap stolen from vehicle – Undetected crime
- Take Motor Vehicle Without Consent – Weyland Road – between 2000 Thur 28th & 0930 29th January 2010 – vehicle taken with spare key left in vehicle, driven around and then left further up the road – Undetected crime
- Criminal Damage (other) – Weyland Road – between 2000 Thur 28th & 0930 Fri 29th January 2010 – garden fence damaged – Undetected crime
- Theft (other) – between 1330 & 1430 Mon 8th February 2010 – scrap metal stolen from garden - Undetected crime
- Burglary (other building) – Weyland Road – between 2100 Sat 30th January & 1000 Wed 3rd February 2010 – outbuilding entered using key left under door and bicycle stolen from within – Undetected crime

Weyland Road priority

Since the priority was set up on 3rd February 2010, there has been only one recorded crime, which is very unlikely to be linked with the ASB problem in the area. On speaking with several residents, it also seems that there has been a significant drop in amount of times youths have been causing problems in the area. According to police patrols, only a handful of youths have been encountered in the area on a few occasions. Youths spoken to have stated that there is “nothing for them to do in the village”. ASB officer Kate Rookyard and ASB police liaison officer Kevin Miller have stated that they will be willing to help out with this if needs be. Patrols will continue and any incidents logged. It is requested that residents continue to call police at the time an incident is happening to enable us to encounter those people involved.
